Between 28 September and 27 October 2023, Central Coast Council sought community feedback on Woy Woy Lions Park District Playspace Upgrade.



We invited the community to complete an online submission form to capture demographic information of the park's users and equipment preferences.


Engagement Results

More than 12,900 social media users reached generating 119 likes, comments and shares.






3. How often have you visited Woy Woy Lions Park in the last year?




4. What time of day are you likely to visit the park?

You said:

"We note from the concept plan that it's proposed to enhance the facility's shade by increasing the number of trees. This is welcome. It's important that suitable trees (e.g. to place and purpose) are selected and sited to provide shade for changing times of day and seasons, and that existing trees are protected, not removed."

"Why is the path a rigid design? Why not curve it around existing trees and give it interest like the existing path. A curved path will be easier to manage for young children on bikes."

"At least 1 piece of equipment that allows people we disabilities to be included in play"
